President Gary Anderson opened the meeting, and Pastor Jaci offered prayer.

A date correction was made to the September 16, 2020 minutes and they were approved.

The September Financial Report was presented and approved.

Old Business:

The church website has been created by Mann Technologies. The proof and link has been supplied to council members for suggestions and/or approval.

Parking lot services will continue until we have extreme weather. Communion will be offered the second and fourth week of the month. We will be discussing how or if we will resume conducting services in the sanctuary during the next few meetings.

New Business:

We will have a Congregational Meeting on November 1, 2020 after the drive in service. The budget will be presented and we will hold the election of officers. We are in need of a chair for the Board of Education and the Board of Congregational Life, and a treasurer.

It is our year to host the Thanksgiving Community Service. Details about how we will conduct the service will be discussed at our next meeting.

Board Reports:

Call Committee: Karen reported that the Call Committee has been meeting and working on the Ministry Site Profile. The next meeting will be on October 13, 2020.

Board of Missions: Nancy reported that 100 blankets and 273 backpacks and personal care kits will be delivered to St. Paul, New Rochester on Saturday morning, October 10, 2020.

Pastor's Report: Pastor reported that she would like to have a Blessing of the Pets Service on October 18, 2020. Members will be encouraged to bring their pets, and treats will be provided for the dogs.

Board of Education: Shirley reported that Affirmation of Baptism is planned for October 25. The board will be providing cookies for the congregation to celebrate the event.

Announcements:

All members of our congregation are reminded to put their Elect Jesus signs in their yards if they have one.

The next council meeting will be held on October 28, 2020 via Zoom.

A motion was made by Karen, second Nancy, to adjourn the meeting. The meeting concluded with The Lord's Prayer

President's Report - November 2020

Last March, the covid-pandemic forced churches all over America to change how they worship and conduct church activities. Our decisions at Grace emphasized practices to protect the health and safety of Grace's members, especially our many older members. We stopped holding in-person meetings or activities and after a series of virtual worship sessions, changed our worship services to Drive-Up Worship. When all this started, we hoped the emergency might be over by summer, but November will now be our ninth month of this. With covid cases again escalating in Ohio and most other states, we can expect several more months of this before we will return to anything resembling normal worship and church activities.

As the Grace Council continues to evaluate the alternatives for worship, we have decided that the best alternative is to continue worshipping outside as long as possible. We have several members who tell us that with their health or age situations they feel safe with outdoor worship and would not feel safe entering the sanctuary. We know we have other members who want to return to worship in the sanctuary. There are several churches in the area that are worshipping indoors but we are not sure this is the safest approach, especially given the current increase in covid infections.

The Council has adopted a contingency plan for conducting worship in the sanctuary that will be followed if colder weather makes outdoor worship impossible. However, this plan has significant "best practice" restrictions. Family units would be seated in every other pew. Masks are required throughout the service. There would be no hymn singing, no passing of the peace, no passing of offering plates; communion would be the same as how we are doing it in the parking lot (bring your own elements or take pre-packaged communion kits). At this point, parking lot worship appears to be safer and the worship experience is probably just as meaningful as it would be in a best practice restricted in-sanctuary worship.

In his weekly message to Synod Churches in the last week of October, Bishop Beaudoin quoted Galatians 6:9, which reads, "So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up". He then went on to say:

Dear Friends in Christ, this is not the time to let our guard down and grow weary. Please follow your Parish Plans of Return. Please show some love and grace to your pastors, deacons, and parish leaders, who are trying so very hard to keep you and the community safe. Please do your part as a follower of Jesus to encourage, strengthen, and build up the people around you. So, let us not grow weary of being the people whom God has called us to be.

The covid-era continues, and we cannot let ourselves "grow weary" of the limitations this pandemic has placed on our lives and our worship. The Grace Council must continue to make decisions that choose between safety and trying to return to normal. Our decisions will continue to maintain the health and safety of our members

Not every decision will satisfy everyone, but we hope all of our members will continue their commitments to "build up the people around us."

WORSHIP PLANS FOR NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER. The Council recently confirmed these plans for worship during the next two months:

- **Sunday Worship**. Sunday worship will continue to be drive-up worship in the parking lot, starting at 10:00 AM, as long as weather permits.
- **Parish Plan of Return.** Grace has a plan of return that can be implemented if and when the weather mandates a return to in-sanctuary worship.
- **Communion**. Communion will be served on the 8th and 22nd of November. In December, communion will be served on the 6th, 20th and 24th.
- **Christmas Eve Service.** There will be a Christmas Eve service at 7:00 PM on the 24th of December. The service will be held outside in the parking lot and will include carols, communion and candles.
- **Advent Wednesday Evening Prayer Services.** Advent evening prayer services will be held on 2, 9 and 16 December. Services will be outdoors starting at 7:00 PM. There will be no Advent soup suppers this year.
- Grace Financial Matters. The 2021 budget for Grace was presented to the Congregational Meeting on the 1st of November. Projections at this point indicate that members will meet or come very close to meeting the weekly offerings target of \$2,885 per week that was approved in the 2020 budget. Net income vs. expense projections for 2020 indicate that Grace will end this year with a small surplus. The 2021 budget also projects a small surplus at the end of next year. This good financial situation is due to several factors. Members have continued to give during the covid-emergency, and we have been conservative in making expenditures during this difficult year. The biggest impact of all may simply be the fact that Grace changed from a full-time pastoral compensation package to a half-time package in September 2019.
- Support and Care for Each Other. As the challenges of the covid-emergency continue, it is important for all of us in the Grace family to support the church by attending worship and continuing to pray and care for each other. Please remember especially those on our Prayer Concerns list and those with special needs.
