A BIBLE STUDY ON THE APOSTLES' CREED - PART I

This week's Bible Study continues a recent series of study themes that are based on Martin Luther's **Shorter Catechism.** This discussion looks at part I of the Apostles' Creed and how Luther and we might interpret it.

THE CREED: I BELIEVE IN GOD, THE FATHER ALMIGHTY, CREATOR OF HEAVEN AND EARTH.

Genesis 1:1. In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth.

Psalm 90:2. Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting, you are God.

Revelation 4:11. You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being.

Luther's SHORTER CATECHISM – THE CREED, on God and creation

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

What is this? **or** What does this mean?

I believe that God has created me together with all that exists. God has given me and still preserves my body and soul: eyes, ears, and all limbs and senses; reason and all mental faculties. In addition, God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all property—along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life. God protects me against all danger and shields and preserves me from all evil. And all this is done out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all! For all of this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve, and obey him. This is most certainly true.

A creed is a formal statement of Christian belief. Each Sunday during worship we join with Christians around the world to reaffirm what we believe by reciting either the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed. The longer Nicene Creed is used during Advent, Christmas, Easter and on festival days. The Apostles Creed is used during Lent and at other times during the Christian year. Legend said the apostles themselves wrote the Apostles' Creed, but there is no evidence of that. The Apostles' Creed as we know it today, first appeared in the 8th century, although similar versions or parts of this Creed were used in worship as early as the second century A. D.

The trinitarian structure of the Creed (Father-Son-Holy Spirit) was used in the early Christian Church in the rite of baptism. Candidates for baptism in the second and third centuries were asked to affirm their belief in God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Today, in the ELCA liturgy for Holy Baptism, a question-and-answer form of the Apostle's Creed is used so parents, sponsors, and the entire congregation can profess their faith on behalf of the infant being baptized.

The Apostles' Creed begins with the most fundamental of all affirmations: "I BELIEVE IN GOD." It continues by saying three things we believe about God. God is the FATHER of all living creatures. God is ALMIGHTY or all powerful. God is the CREATOR of the universe.

Affirmations of God the Creator are found all over the Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments. The very first verse in the Bible identifies God as the Creator of the universe. Psalm 90 is just one of many tributes to God the Creator in the Psalms. And in Revelation, at the end of the Bible, we are again called to give "*glory and honor*" to God who "*created all things*."

Martin Luther's view of God in the **Shorter Catechism** begins with a personal witness: "God has created me." If we say with Luther that "I am God's creation," what does that say about how we should live our lives? Luther's explanation of this part of the Creed emphasizes how God protects us and provides all that we need, including food, clothing, spouse, domestic security, and income producing property. Luther goes on to explain how God does all this for us "out of pure, fatherly, and divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness of mine at all." Luther concludes by saying that all we must do is "thank and praise, serve, and obey him." Luther's teaching about grace alone (Sola Gratia) comes shining through in this explanation.

On Sunday, when we say the Apostles' Creed together again, try to think for a moment about what it means to say, "I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth." Remember God's artistry in the last beautiful sunset you saw. Or consider the complexity of nature. How does a spider know how to spin her web? How does a young robin know how to make a specific type of nest? How do monarch butterflies manage migrations to and from overwintering sites in Mexico? Or most breathtaking of all, consider the vastness of the universe. Think about how scientists have now discovered light from a star that is nine billion light years away. The magnitude of God's creation is beyond comprehension.

The Apostles' Creed says we believe there is a creator God who does all these magnificent things. We in all humility can only respond with awe, wonder, thankfulness, and worship. Martin Luther said, "this is most certainly true." There is nothing more that we can say.

- WE LOOK FORWARD TO WELCOMING ALL MEMBERS OF THE GRACE FAMILY TO WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY! VISITORS ARE ESPECIALLY WELCOME. Please note the following special information:
 - Worshipping in Your Car. Anyone who does not wish to attend worship in the sanctuary, may worship while remaining in their cars. Grace worship services are broadcast on FM 94.1. Parking places are reserved for those who remain in their vehicles in front of the north (office) entrance. If you plan to worship while remaining in your vehicle, please park by that entrance so Pastor Jaci can find you during communion.
 - Mask wearing is optional. Mask wearing is currently not required at Grace, but
 with the resurgence of covid in many areas, the CDC is encouraging even those
 who are vaccinated to wear masks for indoor gatherings. Anyone who wishes to
 wear a mask while worshipping at Grace is certainly encouraged to do so.
- BAPTISM ON 26 SEPTEMBER. The baptism of Mia Pirkl, infant daughter of Tim and Rebecca Pirkl, granddaughter of Mark and Jen Haar, and great-granddaughter of Merle and Ruth Haar, will take place during the worship service on the 26th of September. This worship service will take place in the Grace sanctuary.

Health precautions being followed in the Fellowship Hall will continue. They include socially distanced seating in every other pew, optional mask wearing, stationary offering, stationary passing of the peace, and communion in your pews. Broadcasting on 94.1 FM will continue for those who wish to worship in their vehicles. Please park in front of the main church entrance if you wish to remain in your vehicle.

We don't know yet whether this will be a permanent move back to the sanctuary. Grace's traditional move from the Fellowship Hall back to the sanctuary has been in September, but with the uncertainty of the covid epidemic, we will see how worship in the sanctuary goes and then determine what is best. In that regard, your feedback to Pastor, or to any member of the Council would be helpful.
