Celebrating God's Faithfulness

While we have many different things to do this summer in the US, the one that brings the most joy to us is connecting with each of you, and sharing and celebrating God's work in Slovenia. Just before we left, we gathered as a team to write the names of the students that we had been reading the Bible with last year, then share the stories of how God has been at work in their lives, and pray for them. These stories are not the only ways God is working though our ministry and through your prayers and investment, but it is our privilege to share them with you.

When Jesus entered into Jerusalem during the Triumphal Entry, his disciples were praising him and crying out in loud voices, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest" (Luke 19:38). The Pharisees told Jesus to rebuke his disciples' shouts of praise and worship. Jesus responded by saying, "I tell you, if these were silent, the very stones would cry out" (Luke 19:40). We are praying that the people represented by these stones would cry out in praise to Jesus, that they would truly follow him and help make disciples for Him across Slovenia.

We will be going to Texas August 4-30, to continue to connect and share with you. We will be connecting with you soon as we try to fill our short time there. Please join us in praying for our time there, that God would connect us with new referrals and ministry partners that will invest in Slovenia prayerfully and financially. Praise God that He has provided us with housing, a car, and car-seat while we are there. We are overwhelmed by your support and care for us on these trips.

We have one more important celebration to share with you, and that is the news that Zina has finally received her green card, and is now a permanent resident of the US. This is the end of two years of prayer, persistence, and patience to get through the process, and we are very thankful to finally have it and be ready to move on to the next steps. Thank you for your prayers with us in the process, and we hope that you too can celebrate the good news!

Council Minutes

July 15, 2021

Council President Gary Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm on Zoom. Pastor Jaci offered a prayer to start the meeting.

Good News reports included our new Pastoral relationship that began July 4, 2021; a new supply pastor relationship on July 11, 2021; Linda Stewart is doing well after surgery; and Michelle and Josh Wolfe are the proud parents of a new baby boy, Beckett James.

The minutes of the June 17, 2021, council meeting were approved as presented. Highlights included \$10,700+ income over expenses, the checking account is healthy, and there is \$26,000+ in the maintenance fund. The financial report was approved as presented. The 2021 budget was revised to allow for Pastor Jaci's compensation package, as well as an increase in the amount allocated for supply pastors. We paid a slightly higher church mutual insurance premium of \$4,000. The bell tower restoration project is complete and came in under the amount that was approved by the congregation. Well done, board of property! Much discussion ensued on how and when to utilize the bell during worship. Pastor Jaci was tasked with determining the use of the bell during the Lord's Prayer. A Blessing of the Backpacks for students returning to school will take place on Sunday, August 29, during worship. The baptism of Mia Pirkl, daughter of Meghan (Haar) and Tim, is scheduled for Sunday, September 26, during worship.

Nancy had no report for the board of Education. She stated she has had difficulty getting volunteers to serve on the board.

Steve reported that the next board of Property meeting will be August 5 at 5:30 pm at church. The required water quality testing unfortunately received a negative report. Randy ran a lot of water and then ran a second test to submit. Hopefully the problem is that since we have not been in the building the water has not run very much. We will have to see what the results of the 2nd test are. Jazzercise is adding a class Mondays at 6:30, so we will be getting an additional \$65 a month rent starting in September. Steve extended thanks to Merlyn, Randy for doing a lot of extra work at church; and to Steve Blausey for sharpening the blades on a rotary mower to use in the courtyard. The Fellowship Hall will be set up for the Senior Center lunches and those tables will stay up for Sunday worship. Since we no longer have a custodian, every member will need to step up and help out to keep things clean and tidy. The security system is being looked at and maybe more cameras will be added.

The board of Witness and Mission met on Tuesday, July 13. Amy reported that Jay Herman will give a report on his missionary work with CRU on Sunday August 1. There will be a presentation and video. He, Zina, and Ari will be returning to Slovenia on September 10. There will be a chicken BBQ on October 3 following worship. The recipient will be decided by holding a raffle on Rally Day, September 12. The winner of the raffle will get to choose the beneficiary! Backpacks are being sewn by the quilters and will be distributed beginning July 25. Members can pick up the backpacks, fill them with required items (lists will be in the backpacks), and return to church by Rally Day. These school kits will then be donated to a distribution center.

The next Council Meeting will be Thursday, 19 August, at 7:00 pm. We will most likely meet in person at church!

The meeting adjourned at 8:22 pm with the Lord's Prayer.

Dear Grace Members,

The Board of Worship is pleased to announce that Grace will return to indoor, in-person worship beginning on Sunday, August 1, 2021, at 10:30am in the Fellowship Hall. After much discussion we have developed the following plan for our in-person worship:

- 1. In-person summer worship services at Grace will begin at 10:30am to accommodate Pastor Jaci's dual partnership with Bethlehem Lutheran. We will hold services in the Fellowship Hall for the summer months (move to the Sanctuary TBD). Once a schedule has been created for the remainder of the year between Bethlehem and Grace, we will announce any time change to the congregation.
- 2. The sanctuary will be set up with rows of chairs and tables in the Fellowship Hall.
- 3. The FM transmitter will continue to broadcast services on 94.1 FM for those who are unable to or prefer not to enter the facility for worship right now. Please allow the parking spots in front of the office entrance to be reserved for those congregation members. When we move to the Sanctuary, parking spots in front of the main church entrance will be reserved.
- 4. Grace will continue to utilize the emailed worship service and hymn sheets for those who wish to continue using their hand-held devices or print them each week. Printed copies will be made available (as we have done during drive-up worship).
- 5. Hymnals will be available for use during the service and congregational singing will be permitted.
- 6. We will continue to schedule two deacons for each Sunday. Deacons should arrive early to make sure everything for the service is ready. Deacons will continue to hand out worship bulletins and hymn sheets and take head counts each Sunday.
- 7. Deacons will not pass the offering plates during the service. Instead, the offering plates will be stationary at the entrance to the church. Deacons will remind members to place their offering in the plates either before or after the service.
- 8. We will resume having a rotation of Lectors who read scriptures each Sunday.
- 9. Grace will continue to do a sharing of the peace during the service; however, it will be different from our pre-Covid sharing of the peace. Pastor Jaci will still instruct the congregation to "share the peace of Christ" with one another and to which the congregation will respond "and also with you," but congregation members are encouraged to wave, smile, give a 'peace' sign with your fingers, etc. to other congregation members and refrain from moving around. Congregation members may share peace by embracing their own family members should they choose to do so, but the sharing of the peace will be brief (as it has been during drive-up worship).
- 10. Grace will continue to utilize the communion kits as well as allow congregation members to continue to bring their own communion elements that will be consecrated during the service (as they have been during drive-up worship). The rows of chairs will be spaced further apart so that Pastor Jaci can move between the rows (as opposed to congregation members going forward for communion) to administer communion to congregation members. For the foreseeable future, we will utilize the kits (and members bringing their own elements) for communion and will re-evaluate our procedures for communion in the future.
- 11. Chancel Choir will resume weekly anthems beginning on Rally Day (Sunday, September 12, 2021.) The first Choir practice will be held on Tuesday, September 7, 2021, at 7pm. Rehearsals are at 7pm each Tuesday.



REPORT OF THE GRACE COUNCIL

Significant changes have come to Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church during July and August of this year. Our church is entering a new era in its life and history. We called a new Pastor, entered into an exciting new partnership with Bethlehem Lu-President's theran Church in East Toledo and, as of the 1st of August, will have returned to indoor worship.

Pastor Jaci Tiell is Grace's New Called Pastor. When Pastor Mark Wentz resigned his call at Grace in August 2019, we began a "call process" to determine who would be Grace's next called pastor. Pastor Jaci Tiell first became our Interim Pastor in September 2019. Our call process began with a series of Congregational Discovery sessions in February and March of 2020. Those sessions were designed to involve the whole congregation in discerning God's mission for our parish. Achieving balanced budgets for 2020 and 2021 helped us realize that Grace could support a part-time Pastor but not a full-time Pastor.

The Council nominated a Call Committee that was formally elected by the Congregation during its 30 August 2020 meeting. The Call Committee met frequently in late 2020 and early 2021 to draft a Ministry Site Profile (MSP) that is a formal part of the ELCA call process. By April and May of this year, the work of the Holy Spirit and the vision of Grace's Call Committee came together in the development of an innovative pastoral leadership plan. With the encouragement and blessing of the Northwest Ohio Synod (NWOS), the Grace congregation voted, on the 20th of June, to call Pastor Jaci as its part-time Called Pastor. This new call is based on a partnership through which Pastor Jaci will also serve as a part-time Pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran. On the 22nd of July, Synod Bishop Daniel Beaudoin formally installed Pastor Jaci in this 'partnership call' during an Installation Worship Service at Bethlehem. Pastor Jaci Tiell is the new called Pastor for Grace and Bethlehem. Thanks be to God!

The work of the Call Committee was concluded when Pastor Jaci was installed as our new called Pastor. We wish to extend a sincere thank you to the members who served on that committee: Amy Simkus, co-chair; Matthew Haar, co-chair; Karen Hammel, Randy Jacobs, John Marik and Ruth Ann Anderson.

Return to Indoor Worship. Now after 62 weeks of outdoor worship, Grace's Board of Worship and Council made the decision to return to worship inside the church, starting on the 1st of August. Worship inside won't be the same because the threat of covid infections still exists. Seating will be socially distanced. Offering plates will be available but they will not be passed. The passing of the peace will be done without people moving. Communion elements will be blessed, but they will not be distributed in the traditional way. (Detailed instructions for the return to indoor worship were prepared by Grace's Board of Worship and published in the last two Weekly Messages in July.). The covid crisis hasn't gone away but with so many of our members now being vaccinated, we are able to take this important step by once again being able to worship inside our church. Again, thanks be to God!
