#### A BIBLE STUDY ON THE FIRST COMMANDMENT

One of the most celebrated documents in Lutheran Church history is Martin Luther's **Small Catechism**. Luther wrote the Catechism to give Evangelical families an educational tool for teaching the basics of Lutheran beliefs. During the coming months, several **Weekly Message** Bible Studies will look at selected topics from Luther's **Small Catechism**. This week we'll start with what the Catechism and the Bible say about the First Commandment.

The Bible: The First Commandment: Exodus 20:3-5a

<sup>3</sup>"You shall have no other gods before me. <sup>4</sup>"You shall not make for yourself any carved image with a likeness of anything in the heavens above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below the earth. <sup>5</sup>You shall not bow down to them or serve them;...

Luther's Small Catechism: The First Commandment "You shall have no other gods."

What does this mean?

We are to fear, love, and trust God above all things.

### THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

The Ten Commandments are recorded in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5. The Biblical narratives describe how God revealed the commandments to Moses during his 40-days of encounters with God on Mount Sinai, which occurred during the Israelites' 40 years of wilderness wandering. Ten Commandments are a fundamental set of biblical principles for ethics and worship. At Grace ELC, the Ten Commandments are featured in one of the revered stainedglass windows that adorn Grace's sanctuary.

Verses 3 and 4 are sometimes regarded as two different commandments although they say the same thing in two different ways. Verse 3 is a straightforward commandment to love God, as Luther's Small Catechism states, "above all things." Verse 4 is a negative commandment that tells us not to do things that would show love for idols and false gods or contradict God's commandment to "have no other gods."

Most of us understand what "other gods" were in the Bible but we may struggle to understand what today's "other gods" are. We know about Baal statues, and the golden calf the Israelites crafted while Moses was on Mount Sinai. We can say with confidence that we don't make images of false gods or bow down to them. But let's think that through again. Many people pay far more attention to making lots of money and getting rich or to acquiring power over others than to anything we do to show love for God. Many Ohio State Buckeye or Cleveland Indians Fans expend far more emotional energy and enthusiasm in supporting those "gods" than they expend in attending worship or supporting church activities. Things like that have become our "golden calves." We do have "other gods" that often come before God.

Luther's *Catechism* tells us we are to "fear, love, and trust God above all things" but it's hard to understand how to do that. Perhaps the best answers for loving God lie in Jesus' teachings. In Matthew 22:36-38, a Pharisee asked Jesus, "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the law?" Jesus' answer is well known, "You shall

love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all **your mind**." That answer leaves us with the same dilemma, how do we do that? But Jesus' next statement gives us a clear answer: "And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Now loving God "above all things" starts to make sense. We can love God by loving our neighbors, those whom God created. But that love cannot be selective: we must love all whom God created, regardless of their color, race, ethnic identity, or sexual identity.

In his weekly message to Synod churches, Bishop Beaudoin pointed out a second way to love God "above all things." The Bishop said, "One of the ways we get to love God is by tending the earth." Genesis 1:26-27 tells us God created man and woman "in the image of God." That means God created us to be, like him, creators. We can love God "above all things" by truly loving and caring for our neighbors and by continuing God's creative work by caring for his creation and making it better.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO DRIVE TO BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH

If your car has a navigation system, or if you use Google Maps, put "106 West Plumer Road, Toledo OH" into the search line, or follow these directions:

- From the Church, go 12 miles northwest on Highway 51 (Woodville Road)
- Turn left onto Wales Road (at the stoplight just before I280 entrance)
- Go 2 miles on Wales Road, then turn right onto E Broadway St.
- Go 0.5 miles on E Broadway St., then turn left onto E Andrus Road
- Go 0.8 miles on E Andrus Road, then turn left onto Tracy Road
- Go 0.2 miles to Bethlehem Lutheran Church (on the left)
- The Church is on the corner of W Plumer and Tracy
- The Bethlehem parking lot is on the north side of the Church

Travel distance is 17 miles from Elmore; takes 23-25 minutes
