#### A BIBLE STUDY ON THE SECOND COMMANDMENT

The Bible Study for this week considers the second commandment and what Luther's **Shorter Catechism** teaches about that commandment.

#### Exodus 20:7

<sup>7</sup>You shall not use the name of the Lord your God for evil purposes, for the Lord will not let anyone who uses his name for evil purposes to go unpunished.

#### Luther's Shorter Catechism: The Second Commandment

You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God.

What is this? **or** What does this mean?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not curse, swear, practice magic, lie, or deceive using God's name, but instead use that very name in every time of need to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God.

The second commandment was traditionally understood as a commandment against using God's name in profanity, but it is much more than that. Luther's *Catechism* expands the commandment's prohibition by teaching that we should "not curse, swear, practice magic, lie, or deceive using God's name." The Old Testament provides many examples to help us understand the commandment's full meaning.

Numbers 30:2 provides a biblical standard for the second commandment: "When a person makes a vow to the Lord, or swears an oath to bind themselves by a pledge, they shall not break their word...". Moses instructed the Israelites in

the Wilderness by telling them, "You shall fear the Lord your God; him alone you shall worship; to him you shall hold fast, and by his name you shall swear" (Deut. 10:20). Zechariah 8:17 makes God's judgment about evil or false oaths clear: "do not devise evil in your hearts against one another or love any false oath; for all these are things that I hate, says the Lord." Conversely, those who "do not swear deceitfully...will receive a blessing from the Lord..." (Psalm 24:4-5).

The second commandment is about ethical oath-taking. An oath is a solemn promise to do or say something that is made while appealing to God as a witness. The commandment is concerned that we should only call on God's name when our solemn promise is honorable, and our intent is to fulfill that promise to the best of our ability.

People take many different oaths in public life. Doctors and healthcare professionals take the Hippocratic Oath to practice medicine to achieve good outcomes. Court witnesses take an oath to speak the "truth and nothing but the truth." Citizens take an oath of allegiance in which they affirm their loyalty to their country and its laws. Public officials take an oath of office in which they swear to perform their duties in accordance with established law. In taking these oaths, we typically call for God's assistance in fulfilling our promises by affirming, "so help me God."

Luther's **Shorter Catechism** emphasizes how oaths or promises made in God's name play a vital role in the lives of Christians. Its second part says, we are to use God's name "in every time of need to call on, pray to, praise, and give thanks to God." We promise to forsake sin in our confessions. Marriage ceremonies are an exchange of solemn vows. When children are baptized, we swear an oath by promising "to support (name) and pray for them in their new life in Christ?" with the answer "**We do**." When baptized members affirm their baptism to become confirmed members, they swear an oath by professing their faith in Christ Jesus and renouncing sin.

When Pastor Jaci is installed as the called Pastor at Grace and Bethlehem Lutheran Churches this week, the members of our congregations will be asked: "People of God, will you receive Pastor Jaci Tiell as a messenger of Jesus Christ...Will you pray for her, help and honor her for her work's sake, and in all things strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ." The second commandment says that when we answer, "We will, and we ask God to help us," we are making a solemn promise to God and each other and are asking God to help us fulfill that promise.

## **WEEKLY NEWS AND ACTIVITIES AT GRACE**

- WORSHIP ON SUNDAY. Worship this Sunday, the 25<sup>th</sup> of July, the nineth Sunday after Pentecost, will be in the church parking lot, starting at 10:30 AM. Pastor Jaci and Church Musician Bobbie will conduct the service. This Sunday's Gospel reading is John 6:1-21. WE LOOK FORWARD TO WELCOMING ALL MEMBERS OF THE GRACE FAMILY TO WORSHIP THIS SUNDAY! - RETURN TO WORSHIP INSIDE. The Grace Family will begin worshipping inside the church on Sunday, the 1<sup>st</sup> of August. The Board of Worship has prepared the following information letter explaining how worship indoors will be conducted:

### Dear Grace Members,

The Board of Worship is pleased to announce that Grace will return to indoor, in-person worship beginning on Sunday, August 1, 2021, at 10:30am in the Fellowship Hall. After much discussion we have developed the following plan for our in-person worship:

- In-person summer worship services at Grace will begin at 10:30am to accommodate Pastor
  Jaci's dual partnership with Bethlehem Lutheran. We will hold services in the Fellowship Hall
  for the summer months (move to the Sanctuary TBD). Once a schedule has been created for
  the remainder of the year between Bethlehem and Grace, we will announce any time
  change to the congregation.
- 2. The sanctuary will be set up with rows of chairs and tables at the back of the Fellowship Hall.
- 3. The FM transmitter will continue to broadcast services on 94.1 FM for those who are unable to or prefer not to enter the facility for worship right now. Please allow the parking spots in front of the office entrance to be reserved for those congregation members. When we move to the Sanctuary, parking spots in front of the main church entrance will be reserved.
- 4. Grace will continue to utilize the emailed worship service and hymn sheets for those who wish to continue using their hand-held devices or print them each week. Printed copies will be made available (as we have done during drive-up worship).
- 5. Hymnals will be available for use during the service and congregational singing will be permitted.
- 6. We will continue to schedule two deacons for each Sunday. Deacons should arrive early to make sure everything for the service is ready. Deacons will continue to hand out worship bulletins and hymn sheets and take a head count each Sunday.
- 7. Deacons will not pass the offering plates during the service. Instead, the offering plates will be stationary at the entrance to the church. Deacons will remind members to place their offering in the plates either before or after the service.
- 8. We will resume having a rotation of Lectors who read scriptures each Sunday.
- g. Grace will continue to do a sharing of the peace during the service; however, it will be different from our pre-Covid sharing of the peace. Pastor Jaci will still instruct the congregation to "share the peace of Christ" with one another and to which the congregation will respond "and also with you," but congregation members are encouraged to wave, smile, give a 'peace' sign with your fingers, etc. to other congregation members and refrain from moving around. Congregation members may share peace by embracing their own family members should they choose to do so, but the sharing of the peace will be brief (as it has been during drive-up worship).
- 10. Grace will continue to utilize the communion kits as well as allow congregation members to continue to bring their own communion elements that will be consecrated during the service (as they have been during drive-up worship). The rows of chairs will be spaced further apart so that Pastor Jaci can move between the rows (as opposed to congregation members going forward for communion) to administer communion to congregation members. For the foreseeable future, we will utilize the kits (and members bringing their own elements) for communion and will re-evaluate our procedures for communion in the future.
- 11. Chancel Choir will resume weekly anthems beginning on Rally Day (Sunday, September 12, 2021.) The first Choir practice will be held on Tuesday, September 7, 2021, at 7pm. Rehearsals are at 7pm each Tuesday.

## INSTRUCTIONS TO DRIVE TO BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH

If your car has a navigation system, or if you use Google Maps, put "106 West Plumer Road, Toledo OH" into the search line, or follow these directions:

- From the Church, go 12 miles northwest on Highway 51 (Woodville Road)
- Turn left onto Wales Road (at the stoplight just before I280 entrance)
- Go 2 miles on Wales Road, then turn right onto E Broadway St.
- Go 0.5 miles on E Broadway St., then turn left onto E Andrus Road
- Go 0.8 miles on E Andrus Road, then turn left onto Tracy Road
- Go 0.2 miles to Bethlehem Lutheran Church (on the left)
- The Church is on the corner of W Plumer and Tracy
- The Bethlehem parking lot is on the north side of the Church

Travel distance is 17 miles from Elmore; takes 23-25 minutes
